3) Reports

a) Officers

i) Secretary (Traci Hamilton)

- (1) No Report

ii) Web Master (Matt Miller)

- (1) The old site is officially down now and the new site is up and running.
(2) Team pages, more information will be coming to help assist coaches in getting their team web-pages up and running.

iii) Ways and Means (Dennis Gregory)

iv) Registrar (Deanna and Stephanie)

- (1) Rosters – the girl's rosters are almost complete (preliminary girls rosters handed out to the coaches).
(2) The rosters however are not finalized – there could be players moved around and added still
(3) Boys' micro – we need coaches if anyone is interested!
(4) Birth certificates – the registrars may need help from coaches in getting birth certificates sent in. Kids cannot be added to a final roster without the birth certificate.
(5) Registration closes 06/30 – if you have any questions regarding players either returning or not, please email the registrars
(6) 573 kids registered to date.

v) Treasurer (Greg Jones)

- (1) Not much more to report this meeting. Registration fees collected to date through Bonzai \$32,000. Still additional fees to be deducted still

vi) Referees (Bill Lower)

- (1) Reminder that the referee/player development program is happening at Riverside on Tuesdays for Boys and Thursday for girls.
(2) For those who are practicing at Riverside, just a reminder that you can practice at the back fields but please do not interfere with the lower fields.
(3) There was a grade 8 class held last weekend:
(a) 27 registered people
(b) PSC paid for 9 of them as they have agreed to be club referees
(c) 30 took the final test, of which 29 passed. 1 will re-take the test.
(2) If there are any kids interested in becoming a referee, please let Bill know.

vii) Vice President (Ralph Hutson)

- (1) If you are practicing currently, or planning to practice in July, please contact Ralph at 360-893-4030 to confirm. This will be to confirm if the field is full as well as to get permission if it is a field out of the boundaries.
 - (2) The club is going to be short fields this season:
 - (a) The club may ask for some help in getting Shaw Road back in shape.
 - (b) Fruitland – they are allowing games only for small sided teams, no practicing allowed there.
 - (c) Rainier Woods – this is a Puyallup Parks field suggested by a coach. The club has not previously applied but may be an option for small-sided teams and/or for games.
- viii) President (Benson Burleson)
- (1) Shaw Road – its okay to practice there now, but a reminder that teams won't be assigned until next meeting.
 - (2) For those coaches who need keys for the equipment boxes, please contact Benson.
 - (3) School Use Permits will be scanned on the linked to the website. It is a good idea if all coaches carry a copy of the permit for any field they may be using for practices.
- ix) Tournament Director (Jim Gregory)
- (1) Two applications in already for the tournament and Jim is starting to get emails of questions about it as well.
 - (2) There is possibly a discount for club teams, but it will require volunteer hours to receive. The discount would come as a rebate once the tournament is done and the volunteer hours accounted for.
 - (3) Ways and Means is working to secure local sponsorship as a fund-raising opportunity. If anyone has any ideas or suggestions, please let Jim know. You can email him at coachjimmy@msn.com.
 - (4) One suggestion made was to share profits with food vendors. This is not a possibility due to an agreement between Washington Premier and PSC. However, vendors can be brought in for clothing, equipment etc. Maybe can work in a getting a food vendor at the school but that is not confirmed yet.
 - (5) We will be able to host up to 80 teams this season and using both sets of fields.
- 4) Old Business
- a) Club Jerseys have been shipped and numbers still need to be added. There were no youth X-L ordered so those kids needing that size will be issued adult smalls.
 - b) Just a reminder to coaches that these jerseys will need to come back to the club at the end of the season. It will be the coaches' responsibility to get them back.
- 5) New Business
- a) July 15th, Washington Premier is co-hosting with our club a clinic from 10-1200 at Shaw Road.
 - i) The clinic will be for kids up to U12 and will be posted on the website.
 - b) Washington Premier also offered to give the club \$10 for each camper at the 07/31 – 08/4 camp. The clinic costs approximately \$85 for each week.
 - c) Skyhawks will be hosting their camps through the Fife/Edgewood club this year. There will not be any held in Puyallup.
 - d) August 5th – free goalie clinic hosted in two sessions. More info to come and it will also be updated on the website.
 - e) Micro coaches – we play at Woodland, inter-club league. FME and South Hill are not going to participate, leaving Spanaway, Graham, Franklin Pierce and Puyallup. PSC is the hosting club this season which means the PSC coaches will be responsible for setting up and taking down the fields.
- 6) Good of the Game – Suggestion that perhaps the coaches should put together an out-door team to play recreationally. It's a lot of fun, and keeps the coaches fresh on understanding what the players face on the field!
