- 1) Attendance

- 2) Meeting began: 7:04 PM
- 3) Reports
  - a) Officers
    - i) Secretary (Traci Hamilton)
      - (1) No Report
    - ii) Web Master (Matt Miller)
      - (1) Still working on completion of the template for the team websites. There will be a generic template to help teams put their team page together.
    - iii) Ways and Means (Dennis Gregory)
      - (1) Korum for Kids was approached by the club for sponsorship opportunities. Dennis was advised that they had already sponsored their limit for the year so they are unable to sponsor PSC this year.
      - (2) There are other sponsorship opportunities being sought.
    - iv) Registrar (Deanna and Stephanie)
      - (1) 400 + kids have registered so far.
      - (2) Rosters had been filled with returning players only.
      - (3) The registrars cannot place a player on the team until they have paid and have a birth certificate on file. If you do not see a player you know should be on the roster and is not, please check to see if payment and birth certificate have been accounted for.
      - (4) The rosters opened up May 1<sup>st</sup> to first-come-first-serve but these players cannot be guaranteed spots. Returning players are still offered the priority. In addition, all teams will be balanced as well as possible, so if there are new players, they may have to be placed on a team with fewer players, and that team may not necessarily be the team they want. However, the registrars will do what they can to accommodate everyone.
      - (5) Reminder that assistant coaches must register and have an active RMA on file with the State.
      - (6) There were some flyers that were mailed that were returned by the post-office as either wrong address or moved. Coaches can take a look at the flyers to see if there are any players that can be contacted who did not receive flyers.
    - v) Treasurer (Greg Jones)
      - (1) \$25,000 in registration fees through the website process. Still some additional checks to be deposited, as well as some other fees to still be assessed.
      - (2) See Financials
    - vi) Referees (Bill Lower)
      - (1) June 16<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> there will be a grade 8 referee clinic held at the Riverside Fire station.
        - (a) If a player registers with Bill (before the night before) the club will pay for it.

- (b) The clinic is for ages 14 and older
  - (c) There will be pizza and pop served after the clinic
  - (d) The license will be good though January 2008
  - (e) The player must referee with the PSC. If the player wants to ref for another club, they will have to pay for the license themselves.
- (2) Referee Player development
- (a) This will help keep the referees fresh on the rules and game
  - (b) All teams that can participate will have to be registered with PSC.
  - (c) No guest players allowed
  - (d) No team uniforms
  - (e) Spectators will have to watch from the end of the fields, not on the sidelines
  - (f) June 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be run-though so that the rules are clear. It will be held 6:30-8 pm.
  - (g) Coaches, email Bill with questions
  - (h) Coaches do not need to attend the development, however it is not a babysitting service
  - (i) Each referee will get paid \$15 for participating
  - (j) Benson pitched this idea to TPCJSA and they are very excited about it and support it 100%.
- vii) Vice President (Ralph Hutson)
- (1) No Report
- viii) President (Benson Burleson)
- (1) Advertising signs will be revised for next season and will be put around town, posted at local retailers, posted at the Puyallup Rec center and at busy intersections.
  - (2) 4,000 flyers were given to the various schools in the areas to pass out to the students.
  - (3) Picture day has been posted on the website – September 30<sup>th</sup>. The location has still to be determined.
- ix) Tournament Director (Jim Gregory)
- (1) PVKO was designed by Fine Designs again this year. This logo will go onto sweatshirts, medallions and label pins. It has daffodils and Mt. Rainier on it – more colorful than last year.
  - (2) The logo will be sent to the webmaster to post on the website if you would like to see it.
  - (3) The State had incorrectly posted the tournament information on the web. It has been corrected now.
  - (4) Jim has been working on getting a meeting together with Washington Premier, regarding the expansion of the tournament.
    - (a) The tournament should be able to host 80 teams this year, 30 more than last.
    - (b) There is a possibility that the tournament will be allowed access to fields with lights as well
    - (c) There will be more parking.
    - (d) Volunteers – the tournament director will need volunteers to help. This year any team discounts for offering volunteers will be given in a rebate form, once the volunteer work has been completed. Last season there were many volunteers who did not end up helping.
    - (e) Team packets will be handed out on the first day of the tournament, and the rules and regulations will be on line available to view.
    - (f) We will need volunteers as well for committees:
      - (i) Advertisement
      - (ii) Logistics, field marshals
      - (iii) Awards
    - (g) There is another opportunity for vendors, fundraising. Code 4 and Lester's have expressed interested so far.

- (h) There is discussion of charging for parking as well, \$1?
